Nineteen State and Local Psychiatric Groups Urge State Insurance Commissioners to Reject Proposed Health Insurance Merger

WHAT:

Nineteen American Psychiatric Association (APA) District Branches/State Associations have joined with the APA, the American Medical Association, the American Academy of Family Physicians and others in expressing concern about the proposed health insurance industry mergers that would leave the vast majority of health care administration in the United States to three major insurers. This would eliminate consumer choice and encourage insurers to raise prices and reduce quality of care in most markets. Individuals with mental illness, including substance use disorder, are uniquely affected by the impact of these potential mergers

WHEN: Letters are being sent Sept. 24 to insurance commissioners and state attorneys general in 15 states.
